Anti Social Behaviour

- Action Days involving partners inc NCC utilising ASB Enforcement officers, Licensing officers, Immigration officers and Trading standards

Night time Economy - City Safe

Model now in place with the inclusion of licensing officers, NPT and response officers. Figures show a reduction in nearly all violent crime types for this period.

Shoplifting

LPA priority- Retail Crime Team. National trend.

Retrospective facial recognition software now in place as standard practice. Repeat offenders treated as a daily priority. More timely arrests and greater demand reduction.

Public Order




Drug offences


